CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS 2018

RULES

1. The competition shall be played according to the general BCLGA "Conditions of Play".
2. The competition shall be open to 2017 Club Scratch Champions of all clubs affiliated to the Buckinghamshire County Ladies Golf Association. A player may only represent one club during the competition. No substitutions are allowed if the Club Champion is not available to play.
3. The Management of the competition shall be vested in the Competition Organiser appointed by the Executive Committee. Any dispute must be put in writing to the Competition Organiser, who may refer to the Executive Committee for a decision, whose decision shall be final.
4. To be played as a Knockout Singles Competition.
5. Matches shall be played off scratch. The four lowest handicap players will be seeded.
6. The venue of the matches, except for the final, shall be the 'home' club of one of the two opponents and shall be settled by a draw in the first round and advised by the Competition Organiser in subsequent rounds. Permission to play must be obtained from the Secretary of the club, the cost of the green fee, if any, being shared by the players.
7. The 'home' club of each player must be the club that she is representing in the competition. If the player is no longer a member of the club that she is representing, then she must either arrange to play home matches at that club (with no additional cost to her opponent), or she must forfeit her home advantage.
8. The final shall be played on a neutral course. The course and date of the final to be arranged by the Competition Organiser.
9. **The winner of each match must notify the Competition Organiser of the result within 48 hours of the completion of the match. Competitors not complying with this rule will be disqualified.**
10. Responsibility for arranging matches is shared jointly between the two players, who must agree a mutually convenient date between themselves. However, if the "Home" player does not contact her opponent within 7 days of the start of the current Round then she shall forfeit the automatic right to the "Home" venue.

The competition dates for 2018 are as follows:

- *Round 1 must be played between 1st April and 27th May*
- *Round 2 must be played between 28th May and 22nd July*
- *Semi-finals must be played between 23rd July and 9th September*

In order to retain Home advantage, the Home pair must contact their opponents ON or BEFORE the following dates:

- *Round 1 by 8th April*
- *Round 2 by 3rd June*
- *Semi-finals by 29th July*

After these dates, whichever pair makes initial contact may claim the Home advantage.

11. After consultation with the Competition Organiser, if a player gives a walkover in this knockout competition, the player whom she defeated in the previous round may be substituted for the player giving the walkover. In the case of a walkover being offered, either the player giving the walkover or the player receiving the walkover should contact the previous opponent to advise her that she has been reinstated in the competition.
12. Extensions will not be given unless both courses are closed or unavailable on the last day of the round, in which case the Competition Organiser must be contacted to approve an extension. There will be no extension to dates when a losing player from the previous round is reinstated (see Rule 11 above), so if a reinstated player is unable to complete the match within the required dates, the walkover will stand.
13. If a match has not been played by the last day of the round, or the players fail to agree a mutually convenient date, BOTH players will normally be disqualified following consultation with the Competition Organiser.

Additional Rule for all Knockouts:

Juniors are welcome to enter county knockouts, however parents/guardians are reminded that it is their responsibility to arrange for safeguarding of their child.

For each match a 'responsible adult' must be nominated (be it a parent or any other nominated adult) who will be responsible for the junior for the duration of the match. The 'responsible adult' must have details of emergency contact information and any special medical needs of the junior. The junior and her opponent must be provided with the contact telephone number of the nominated 'responsible adult'.

Note: 'duration of the match' includes the time from a junior being dropped off by parents/guardians to their collection by parents/guardians.

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
