



BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY LADIES GOLF ASSOCIATION

B.C.L.G.A. embraces the English Women's Golf Association (EWGA) wishes to encourage the participation of all players regardless of disabilities. The EWGA Policy is available on their website (www.englishwomensgolf.org).

It is a condition of any competition organised by the B.C.L.G.A. that players and caddies shall walk at all times during a stipulated round, unless permitted to use a golf buggy by the organiser of the said competition. A golf buggy may be used by a player or caddie who can provide a valid current medical certificate of disability in accordance with the EWGA policy and has requested permission to use a golf buggy by the closing date for any competition they seek to enter or caddie in. The Organiser may not without good reasons refuse a request. Where a player is under the age of 18 the Organiser shall reserve the right to specify the golf buggy is driven by another person of the Organiser's choice. In cases where the Organiser refuses to permit the use of a golf buggy she shall inform the player of the decision, the reasons for it and the right to appeal this refusal to the Executive Committee with the procedure for such an appeal.

The Organiser shall have regard to additional health and safety considerations before granting approval (for example relevant weather conditions, topography and ground conditions). Approval may be revoked in the event of new health and safety considerations coming to light since granting initial permission. Any player, caddie or other third party granted permission to use a buggy is required to complete and sign a Transportation Policy Consent Form prior to use. A player, caddie or other third party permitted to use a golf buggy must agree to the terms and conditions under 5.1 of the EWGA Policy with point (h) reading a copy of the certificate of insurance to the B.C.L.G.A. Organiser prior to use.
